The open Studio KinderKunstMobil is premiering at the exhibition F.K. Waechter – Draughtsman. As a kind of mobile “workspot” within the Museum für Angewandte Kunst Frankfurt, the Studio KinderKunstMobil invites young visitors to scout out exhibitions on their own. In this case, children and teens can use the available materials to explore F.K. Waechter’s draughtsmanship independently, become artists themselves and exhibit their works. The studio is open daily during the museum’s regular visitor hours.
